#### 2. Bois de Sioux – Mustinka CWMP- Informal Review Comment / Response Table

Committee members reviewed comments that did not result in the requested plan changes and comments that resulted in further questions for the committee. Beyer and House requested that the implementation "Technical Advisory Committee" be changed to the "Planning Committee," to reduce confusion with other inter-organization, existing advisory committees.

Beyer requested that two 20 Year Trend precipitation maps that the DNR added to the plan under the comment period, be replaced or revised to match 30 Year Trend data provided by the DNR's Bois de Sioux and Mustinka Climate Surveys under the data collection phase.

## 3. Coming up Next: Formal Review Process

Next steps: It is expected that BWSR's Northwest Regional Committee meets in October and December, and will hold a public hearing to receive comment on the Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan. It is expected that the Policy Committee will approve the plan in September for a 60-day comment period that would end the first week of November.
